What is WMPD?

- The term comes from a report that the United States Congress requires the National Center for Science and Engineering Statistics (NCSES) to deliver in odd-numbered years. The report is called "Women, Minorities, and Persons with Disabilities in Science and Engineering."
- This WMPD Report provides statistical information on these groups' participation in STEM.
- NCSES is a federal statistical agency and is part of the National Science Foundation.

What is Understanding Diversity in STEM: WMPD Day?

- On WMPD Day, people and organizations across the country will:
 - Recognize the gains that have been made and gaps that remain.
 - Celebrate
 - the stories of women, minorities, and persons with disabilities in STEM who are making a huge difference in their communities and across the world.
 - the organizations that are creating opportunity and empowering the next generation of WMPD in STEM.
 - Build new ways to empower a more diverse and dynamic STEM workforce.

What is going to happen on Understanding Diversity in STEM: WMPD Day?

- At 11am Eastern/8am Pacific on May 12, a 30-minute program will use WMPD findings to recognize
 gains that have been made and gaps that remain. It will also highlight stories of how broadening
 participation in STEM has created opportunities for researchers and improved quality of life for
 communities across the globe.

- At noon Eastern/9am Pacific, individuals and organizations across the country will take to the airwaves to tell their own stories about inclusion. Using a range of social media platforms, each will highlight efforts to **recognize**, **celebrate and build** the contributions of women, minorities, and persons with disabilities in STEM.
